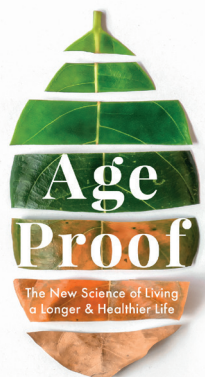

Professor ROSE ANNE KENNY is an award-winning physician and researcher who and has been Head of the academic department of Medical Gerontology at Trinity College Dublin since 2006. She is the founding Principal Investigator of The Irish Longitudinal study on Ageing (TILDA).

Prof Kenny has published over 600 scientific publications to date and was admitted as a Member of the Royal Irish Academy (M.R.I.A) in 2014 – Ireland's highest recognition for scientific excellence.

She recently received a Lifetime Achievement Award for her research on ageing at the world congress in Kuala Lumpur 2019. She was voted a Health Hero by *The Irish Times* in 2018; won the Trinity Innovation Award in 2017 and was elected President of the Irish Geriatrics Society in 2020.

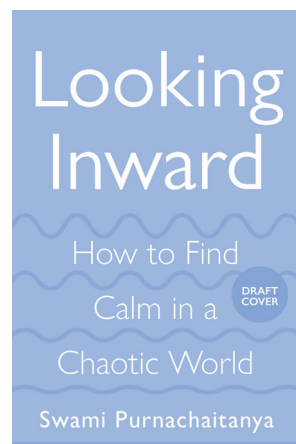

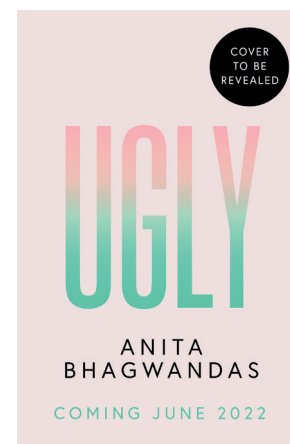

In *Ugly*, Anita uncovers where these beauty standards started, unpicks why they've been perpetuated and unmasks how they're still being upheld.

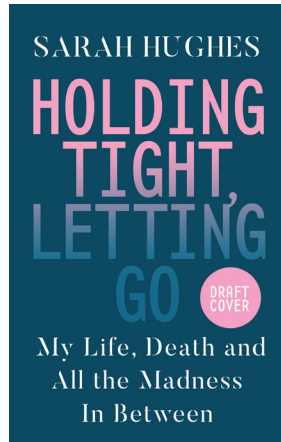

What is it like to know you are going to die? And, more importantly, what can that teach you about how to live?

'Too often we minimise the reality of terminal cancer, concentrating instead on survival records and talking only in positive pink ribbon terms. But what of those who live daily with the shadow of the disease?'

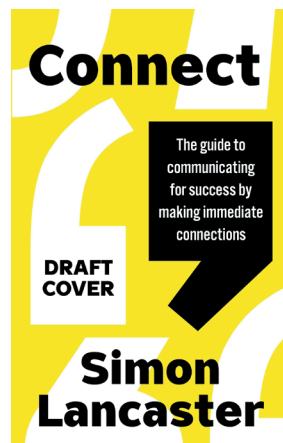

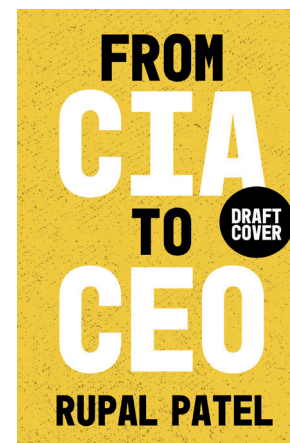

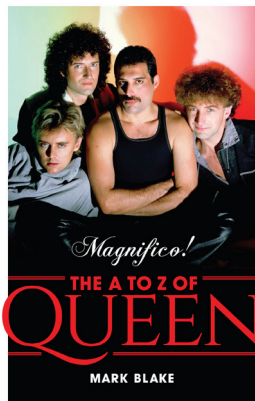

Addressing the phenomenal success of the film *Bohemian Rhapsody*, while challenging the fictionalised account it sold to cinemagoers, Blake builds on the band's enduring audience appeal in order to provide a fresh and unparalleled take on Queen's music, story and legacy.

MARK BLAKE is an acclaimed music journalist and author. Former assistant editor of *Q* magazine and long-time contributor to *Mojo*, Blake has written for many high-profile publications including *Rolling Stone* and *Billboard*. Good, bad and often ugly, here are the Rolling Stones as never before.

PP Arnold's story is that of a rich and varied life. From her early musical origins in powerhouse church gospel, the talented singer's career began when she joined the Ike & Tina Turner Revue at the age of just seventeen. But little did the young Ikette know how much her world was about to be turned upside-down...

Upon arriving in London in 1966 to support the Rolling Stones, the shy but vivacious nineteen-year-old caught the eye of the frontman Mick Jagger. He would persuade her to stay in the city and record as a solo artist, ultimately leading to a five-decade career working with everyone from Jagger, Rod Stewart, the Small Faces, Eric Clapton and Nick Drake to Barry Gibb, Peter Dinklage, Roger Waters, the KLF, Paul Weller and Primal Scream.

However, it has been far from a gilded life for the musical star, who, after being forced into marriage at the age of fifteen upon becoming pregnant, went on to endure a string of personal traumas, including physical abuse from her husband, sexual abuse at the hands of her one-time musical mentor and, later, the tragic loss of her young daughter in a road accident.

Yet the legendary musician survived it all and has continued to reinvent herself through the years, be that as a West End musical actress, as a much-sought-after backing singer or as a renowned pop and soul star in her own right.

Now, for the first time, she is telling her remarkable story. This is the long-awaited memoir of a true soul survivor.

PP ARNOLD (born Patricia Ann Cole) is an American soul singer who has enjoyed continued success in the music industry since coming to fame in the mid-'60s.

People tend to have their favourite era of the Bee Gees' career, but many listeners are also conscious that there is more to uncover about the band. But the Bee Gees' extraordinary career was one of highs and lows. From a vicious but temporary split in 1969 to several unreleased albums, disastrous TV and film appearances, and a demoralising cabaret season, the group weren't always revelling in the glow of million-selling albums, private jets and UNICEF concerts. Yet, even in the Gibbs' darkest times, their music was rarely out of the charts, as sung by the likes of Al Green, Kenny Rogers and Dolly Parton, and Destiny's Child.

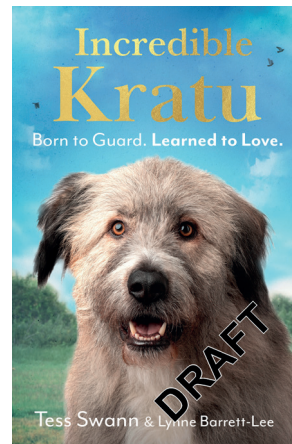

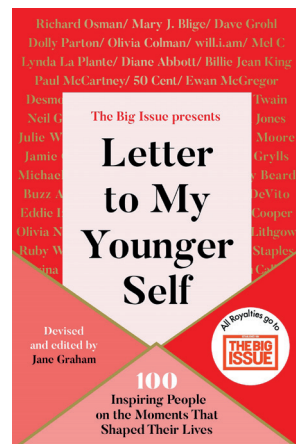

It was her relationship with Kratu that impelled her on her road to self-discovery, and for the first time in her life she started to feel worthwhile. For the past nine years, Tess has devoted her life to making changes; in raising awareness of animal welfare issues and autism-related causes. She also supports the cross parliamentary group APDAWG. Now a dedicated dog welfare advocate and rescue dog ambassador, she also continues to train her five dogs, and, along with Kratu (now her official Assistance Dog), does therapy work at the local primary school.

The global surveillance reach of Five Eyes through its five member countries, including Canada, Australia and New Zealand, is unrivalled – and its joint-operations ultimately brought an end to the Soviet Union during the Cold War.

The Five Eyes has been steeped in secrecy since its formation in 1956, its existence only acknowledged as recently as 2010. On the one hand it is equivalent to a band of brothers drawn together by a common language and cause, whose historical achievements include the takedown of atomic spies in the 1940s to the exposure of Russian collusion in Donald Trump's 2016 presidential campaign. Until now, however, there has been no book detailing its long and complex history. *Five Eyes: The Secret History Through Its Targets, Traitors and Spies* is a character-led narrative that weaves together accounts spanning eight decades – from stories of codebreakers in the Second World War, to the latest Russian threats to Western democracy and the trade conflict between the US and China that have reshaped national security. Its author draws on interviews with intelligence officials and recently declassified archives to reveal authoritative but unauthorised stories, bypassing the usual censorship channels to tell the definitive account of the Western world's most powerful but least known intelligence alliance.

'Kitty's Salon' was transformed into an espionage listening post to spy on its male clientele. This was achieved by secretly installing hidden microphones in every room, and by recruiting twenty young women to 'staff' it. The women were specially selected, not only for their physical attractiveness, but for their high intelligence, knowledge of foreign languages, and devotion to the Nazi cause. They were inducted into the SS and trained to extract information from their clients in pillow talk, but themselves had no knowledge that the rooms were also wired for sound.

The 'Madame' and owner of the establishment, the eponymous Kitty Schmidt, (1882–1954), was bullied, blackmailed and browbeaten by the Nazis into co-operating with the project. Having helped Jews to escape to Britain, she was permanently under the threat of a death sentence or consignment to a concentration camp to ensure her collaboration.

The transformation of Salon Kitty into a spy centre was the brainchild of the most feared Nazi of them all: Reinhard Heydrich. Dubbed even by Hitler as 'the man with the iron heart', Heydrich was overlord of both the SS's secret service, the Sicherheitsdienst (SD); and was Himmler's deputy as overall Chief of the SS.

Now the real story, based on years of painstaking detailed research, piecing together fragmentary evidence and separating it from lies and legends, is told by the authors. *Salon Kitty* and its owner are at the heart of the story, which provides a portal into the context of the wider history of sex, spying and surveillance before, during and after the Third Reich.

This is at once an exploration of male power in politics, a previously almost unknown episode of Nazi and espionage history, and a great story of historical detection.

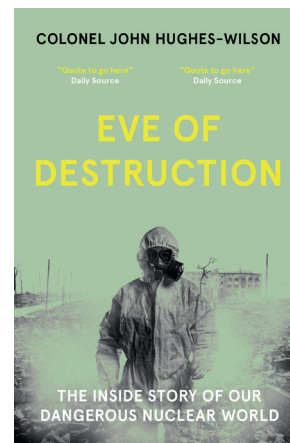

He went on to fight in 2 Para's second major engagement, the battle for Wireless Ridge (2 Para was the only unit to fight two battles in the Falklands campaign) and as the firing died down, he and his comrades found themselves rapidly advancing into Port Stanley. So 2 Para became the first unit of the Task Force into the islands' capital, where they took the unofficial Argentine surrender. After leaving the British Army he worked as a military adviser for the British Government, a war photojournalist and became a bestselling author.

'I look back now and see that I never stood a chance. It's hard when you realise your whole childhood was taken away. I never got the chance to be a child.'

Shaneda Daly was only 6 years old when her father started grooming her. For more than ten years, he would go on to sexually abuse and rape his daughter at least once a day. In her house of doom, the emotional and physical toll on Shaneda was immense. Eventually, her ex-army and prison officer father admitted to his family what he had been doing, agreeing to leave home to get help. SHANEDA DALY is a campaigner and survivor of abuse. She lives in Ireland where she runs Survivors Side By Side and coordinates support group meetings nationwide, as well as campaigns for mandatory life sentences for those convicted of rape or child abuse. This is her first book.

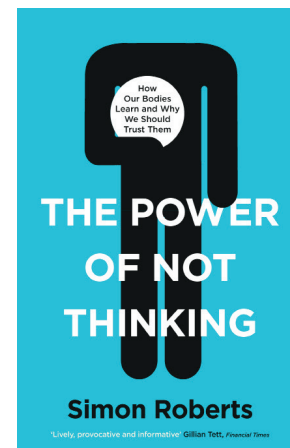

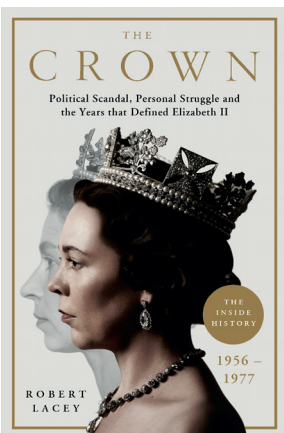
