4. Did the code-breakers at Bletchley Park receive any recognition for their work during the war?
5. If you were working at Bletchley Park, what kind of job might you like to have had?

### HIDDEN HEROES (WOMEN IN WAR)

1. Which jobs did women do during World War II?
2. May women's role in the war be considered a turning point in the history of women's rights?
3. Should their contributions to the war effort be more widely recognised?
4. Might female codebreakers have had a different experience compared to men in the same role?
5. What legacy did women who worked in the war leave behind? How have they influenced society today?

### PIGEON POWER

1. What was the role of carrier pigeons during the Second World War?
2. Were carrier pigeons used by both sides of the conflict during the Second World War?

4. What happened to carrier pigeons who were injured or captured?
