Rory, eleven years old, has not spoken a word since his mother Pip walked out on the family five years ago. He can't believe his luck when he stumbles upon Anna's house of birds. He's long believed birds to be magic, and Anna seems happy to teach him how to help them, not questioning his silence.

Rory's father, Angus, has been struggling since Pip left, but seeing his son so happy with the birds and with the beautiful and enigmatic Anna, he finds the fog he has been mired in finally start to lift.

But as the spring burns on, amid the quiet work of saving the nestlings, alarm bells start ringing. Water becomes scarce. The elderly in the town become fearful. Exhausted birds start falling out of the sky. And then, Anna discovers a body washed up on the shore.

Tender and exquisitely crafted, *These Glass Bodies* is an absorbing, unsettling debut about love, disconnected people and our fragile relationship with the natural world.
